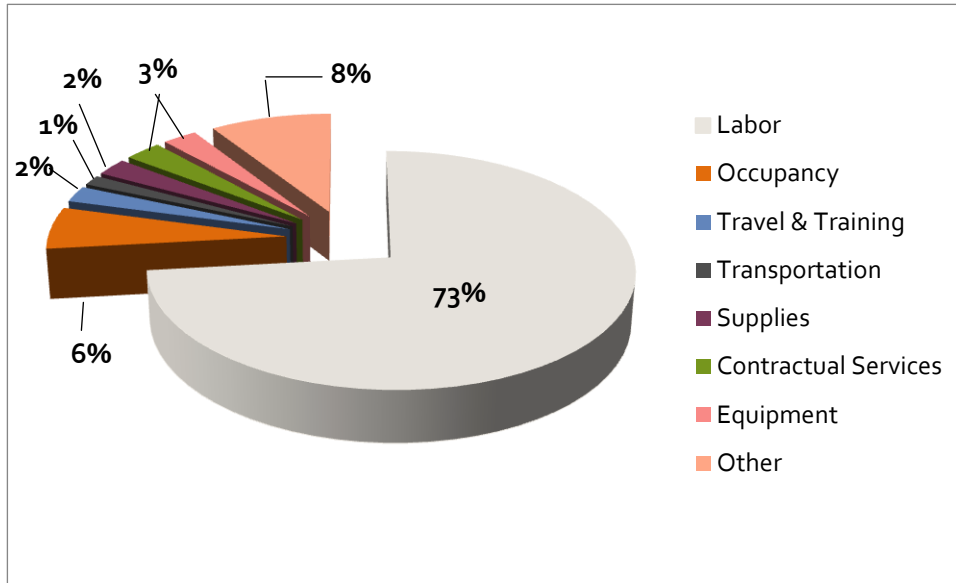
TEACHER INFORMATION
